



Fireworks Safety



- Nationwide more fires are reported every Fourth of July than any other day, with 50% of those fires being fireworks-related.
- Fireworks can cause serious burns, fractures or scars, and can even cause permanent defect and death.
- Most fires are caused by bottle-rocket type fireworks where the rockets land on grassy areas or on rooftops.
- The safest and smartest way to use fireworks is to go watch a public display.
